Getting There

The easiest route to Wilmington, N.C. is to take I-95, then east on I-40. I-40 turns into N. College Road as you enter Wilmington. To reach UNCW, stay on College Road past the Market St. overpass and continue 0.5 mile, then left on Randall Pky. To reach Dobo Hall, follow Randall Pky. 0.25 mi., past the water tower, until you must turn right onto onto Reynolds Dr. After the wooded area, the first building on the right is Dobo Hall.
